This is a disease where cells in the lymphatic system grow abnormally and have the possibility of spreading beyond the lymphatic system. This illness compromises the body's ability to fight infection—but this didn't stop Arabella's fight to stay strong.

Arabella has always dreamt of visiting Australia one day in hopes of hiking mountains, interacting with wildlife, surfing and experiencing a change of culture. As you can imagine, we were determined to make this Cancer-Warrior's wish come true!

When Arabella and her family flew out to Australia, little did they know they were about to have the experience of a lifetime. First, she visited Cairns, Australia. Here, she snorkeled in the Great Barrier Reef, fed fish and observed and interacted

with all the underwater wildlife! She also went on a wildlife preserve tour where she held a Koala bear and baby Alligator. Next, Arabella visited one of Australia's largest cities, Sydney!
